****UTHSCD faculty speak at seminar

DALLAS--Three outstanding faculty members at The University of Texas Health Science Center at Dallas will serve as panelists for a health-related program for women executives Tuesday, Sept. 22 at 6:15 p.m. at the Fairmont Hotel. Billed as a "complimentary professional women's perspective," the program will focus on mental health topics. These include "Time Passages: Life's Changes," "Physiological Changes in Women," "Making Stress Work for You," and "Keeping Mentally Fit."

Panelists will be Dr. Kenneth Altshuler, Stanton Sharp professor and chairman of psychiatry; Dr. Barry Schwarz, associate professor and vice chairman of obstetrics and gynecology, and Dr. Barbara Cambridge, associate professor of obstetrics and gynecology. Moderator will be Jane Boone, vice president of medical communication at Knape & Knape and former local medical television reporter.

Sponsors include Southwest Airlines, the Executive Women of Dallas, the Dallas Chamber of Commerce and the Fairmont Hotel.

The panelists will bring together expertise from the fields of gynecology, psychiatry and counseling. Altshuler, who sees patients in analysis as well as heading up a major department at the health science center, has recently celebrated his tenth anniversary as chairman of his department. His professional experience includes in-depth work in the areas of both sexual counseling and geriatric psychiatry.

Schwarz has seen private patients and acted as a consultant for a number of years in the Department of OB-Gyn as well as taking a major role in teaching medical students and residents. Cambridge is known widely for her work with the Family Planning clinics in Dallas and has also done genetic counseling for the Department of OB-Gyn. Besides her position at the health science center, the counselor has a private practice in which she specializes in grief and loss counseling.

The program is open to interested area women. An informal reception at 5:30 will precede the event.
