A FURTHER REPORT WILL BE MADE AS SOON AS MORE DEFINITE INFORMATION IS AVAILABLE."

IN SOMEWHAT FURTHER EXPLANATION OF THE COMMENT ABOUT THE CLINICAL BUILDING, WE HAVE RECEIVED INFORMATION THAT AS SOON AS WE HAVE A DEFINITE JUDGMENT FROM THE SUPREME COURT ON THE CONSTITUTIONALITY OF THE GAS-GATHERING TAX, WE SHALL RECEIVE AN ALLOCATION FOR THE OTHER MAIN STRUCTURE OF THE SCHOOL. AS YOU ALL KNOW, EFFORTS TO APPROPRIATE SPECIFIC MONEY FOR THAT CONSTRUCTION WERE BLOCKED IN THE RECENT SESSION OF THE LEGISLATURE.
