DALLAS--A Dallas doctor who has volunteered a half day a week for more than 10 years to teach medical residents, interns and students was honored Tuesday night at a meeting of the Dallas-Fort Worth Obstetric and Gynecological Society.

Dr. Harwin B. (Jack) Jamison was presented a plaque citing "outstanding contributions in teaching" at The University of Texas

Southwestern Medical School and Parkland Memorial Hospital.

"Every Monday at 7 a.m. he comes in and scrubs in with the residents in surgery. It may vary from showing a resident basic procedures to very complicated surgery," said Dr. Paul MacDonald, chairman of Obstetrics & Gynecology at UTSMS.
