UT Southwestern hosts Alzheimer's forum

DALLAS – Nov. 12, 2004 – UT Southwestern Medical Center at Dallas will host the annual Friends of the Alzheimer's Disease Center's public forum Nov. 30.

Guest lecturer Kathryn P. Riley, one of the influential authors of the Nun Study, will present results of the longitudinal research of aging and Alzheimer's disease in 678 members of the School Sisters of the Notre Dame religious order. The findings reveal clues about Alzheimer's disease and offer possibilities of delaying the onset and preventing dementia.
