*****Dr. Kenneth Luskey receives Hartford Fellowship.

DALLAS--Dr. Kenneth Luskey, fellow in Internal Medicine at The University of Texas Health Science Center at Dallas, has been named a Hartford Fellow by the John A. Hartford Foundation of New York City. As a Hartford Fellow, Dr. Luskey will receive salary support of \$30,000 a year for three years to continue his research training in intracellular cholesterol metabolism.

Luskey, who is working with Dr. Joseph Goldstein, chairman of Molecular Genetics, and Dr. Michael Brown, director of the Center for Genetic Diseases, is one of 12 Hartford Fellowship recipients in the nation in 1981. Along with his research activities Luskey will continue to see patients in Diabetes Clinic as he did last year as an endocrinology fellow.

This is the second year that the Hartford Fellows Program, designed to help promote the training and development of young physician researchers has been in effect. The Hartford Foundation also makes grants to stimulate health care payment system reforms and to provide efficient use of energy resources.

From 1978 till 1980 Luskey was research associate in the Laboratory of Chemical Biology at the National Institute of Arthritis, Metabolic, and Digestive Diseases. He received a B.A. from The University of Texas, Austin, and an M.D. at UT Southwestern Medical School, UTHSCD. He did his internship and residency in medicine at Barnes Hospital in St. Louis.

Luskey is a diplomate of the American Board of Internal Medicine and a member of both Phi Beta Kappa and Alpha Omega Alpha. He has published several papers on lipoprotein metabolism.
