SOUTHWESTERN MEDICAL SCHOOL  
SCHEDULES COMMENCEMENT JUNE 2

DALLAS -- The University of Texas Southwestern Medical School at Dallas will hold its 27th commencement exercises at 8 p.m. Monday, June 2, at McFarlin Memorial Auditorium at SMU.

Doctor of medicine degrees will be awarded to 96 seniors. This year's class will bring the total of physicians graduated from UTSMS since its beginning in 1943 to 2,164. In addition to the medical degrees, Southwestern also will award 11 master's degrees and 11 Ph.D's in biomedical sciences.

Commencement speaker will be Dr. Carl V. Moore, former vice chancellor for medical affairs and presently professor and chairman of the department of medicine at Washington University, St. Louis.

Presiding will be Dr. Charles C. Sprague, dean. Dr. Robert Merrett Pike will be marshal for the academic procession, with Dr. Ivan E. Danhof, Dr. Robert W. Lackey and Dr. Samuel M. McCann as assistant marshals. Rev. Edward B. Mohns, assistant rector of Highland Park Presbyterian Church, will give the invocation.

The award of Ho Din will be presented by George L. MacGregor, president of Southwestern Medical Foundation. Dr. Reuben Adams, assistant dean for student affairs, will present candidates for the doctor of medicine degree, and Dr. Parkhurst Shore, acting associate dean for graduate studies, will present candidates for graduate degrees. Dr. John Chapman, assistant dean for postgraduate education, will administer the physician's oath. Rev. Roy C. McClung, president of Wayland Baptist College, will give the benediction.

Degrees will be conferred by Dan C. Williams, member of the Board of Regents of The University of Texas System.

Dr. Moore, the commencement speaker, is an internationally known hematologist, or specialist in diseases of the blood. Himself a graduate of Washington University, he has been associated with the institution as faculty member and administrator since 1938. He is an editor of several professional journals in hematology, member of many national professional organizations in medical science, and has served as president of several leading societies.

Regent Williams, a native of Brenham and longtime Dallas businessman, is himself a graduate of The University of Texas, receiving the degree of bachelor of science in petroleum engineering in 1935. His business interests have included oil, real estate, ranching and insurance. He has been associated with Southland Life Insurance Company for the past 25 years, and has been president of Southland Life since 1953. He is president for 1968-69 of the American Life Convention.
