DALLAS -- Dr. William Dock, New York City, leading authority on heart disease, will be the ninth Mr. and Mrs. E. G. Bromberg Memorial Visiting Professor in Medicine at The University of Texas (Southwestern) Medical School at Dallas Dec. 14-19, 1969.

Dr. Dock is professor of medicine, State University of New York, Downstate Medical Center, Brooklyn, N.Y., and chief of medical service at the Veteran's Administration Hospital in Brooklyn. He was invited to Dallas by Dr. Donald W. Seldin, chairman of the department of internal medicine at UTSMS.

Dr. Dock, author of almost 200 papers and articles for scientific journals on many different aspects of heart disease, is a past president of the American Society for Clinical Investigation, diplomate of the American Board of Internal Medicine and a fellow of the American College of Physicians.

A native of Ann Arbor, Mich., Dr. Dock received his medical degree from Rush Medical College, Chicago, with advanced training in Boston, Vienna and California. He was on the faculty of Stanford University School of Medicine for more than 15 years and has been associated with the State University of New York for almost 20 years. He was awarded the Croix de Guerre as a teen-age volunteer with the French Army in World War I, and served as a major in the U.S. Army in World War II.
