

GODDARD FOUNDATION PLEDGES \$40,000 TO UT SOUTHWESTERN FUND DRIVE

DALLAS—June 14, 1993—The Charles B. Goddard Foundation has pledged \$40,000 to the Fund for Molecular Research at The University of Texas Southwestern Medical Center at Dallas. The gift will help purchase equipment for the university's lung disease research programs.

"This is one of many gifts our family has given to UT Southwestern, and it certainly won't be the last," said Ann Corrigan, vice chairman of the Goddard Foundation. The Oklahoma-based family foundation is named for her grandfather, Charles B. Goddard.

"We have always had an interest in the medical center. We believe Dallas really is fortunate to have such a rapidly growing institution like UT Southwestern," said Corrigan.

Corrigan said her family has a particular interest in lung research because her mother suffered from emphysema and some family members are asthmatic.

"If this gift ultimately can help in any way to battle lung disease and the premature death and suffering that can accompany it, we will be grateful," added Corrigan.
