\*\*\*\*Free workshop on "Dietary Lipids and Atherogenesis" scheduled Sept. 20 and 21

DALLAS--A free workshop on "Dietary Lipids and Atherogenesis: New Concepts" will be held at The University of Texas Health Science Center at Dallas on Sept. 20 and 21, 1985. The workshop is sponsored by the Center for Human Nutrition, which conducts basic and clinical research into the relationship between nutrition and health. The workshop is underwritten by the Friends of the Center for Human Nutrition.

Twelve speakers, all nationally outstanding researchers in lipid metabolism, will explore the question of whether fats in the diet contribute to heart disease in ways other than the well established link between low density lipoproteins (LDL) and atherosclerosis.

In addition, speakers will explore effects of dietary lipids on arterial walls, on blood pressure, on blood platelet function and blood clots, and on other processes such as the immune system and cancer development.

Scott M. Grundy, M.D., Ph.D., professor of Internal Medicine and Biochemistry and director of the Center for Human Nutrition, has organized the workshop and will participate as moderator and speaker.
