\* \* \* \* \* Experts meet to study diagnosis by cell study.

DALLAS--The tenth annual meeting of the Texas Society of Cytology will be held March 6 and 7 at the Amfac Hotel, Dallas-Fort Worth Regional Airport. Program topics will be aimed at pathologists, gynecologists and other physicians and allied health workers who have an interest in diagnostic cytology (the study of cells), says Dr. Alice L. Smith, president of the group.

Outstanding faculty for the meeting will include Drs. Leopold G. Koss and Geno Saccamanno. Koss, author of the most authoritative text on the subject, is chairman of the Department of Pathology, Albert Einstein College of Medicine at Montefiore Hospital and Medical Center. Saccomanno, a renowned expert on lung cytology, is research director at St. Mary's Hospital and Medical Center, Grand Junction, Colorado.

In addition to papers presented on the subject, several workshops will be held. These include "Diagnostic Pulmonary Cytology," "A Nongynecologic Potpourri--Changing Criteria for Different Anatomic Sites," "Diagnosis of Malignant Lymphoma," "Fine Needle Aspiration Biopsy of Head, Neck and Subcutaneous Masses" and "Body Cavity Effusions."

Dr. Smith is a professor in the Department of Pathology at The University of Texas Health Science Center at Dallas, which is co-sponsoring the meeting with the Texas Society of Cytology.
