DALLAS -- Seven investigators on the faculty of The University of Texas Southwestern Medical School at Dallas have received grants-in-aid to support basic chemical research in the amount of \$222,000 from the Robert A. Welch Foundation of Houston, the Foundation's trustees announced today.
