DALLAS--Dr. Eugene Braunwald, one of the leading clinical physiologists in cardiovascular disease in the world, will visit The University of Texas Southwestern Medical School November 26-30 as the Mr. and Mrs. I.G. Bromberg Visiting Professor of Medicine.

Currently chairman of the Department of Medicine at Peter Bent Brigham Hospital, Harvard Medical School, the visitor also serves as Hersey Professor of the Theory and Practice of Physic at that institution. He is well-known for his editorial and editorial related activities for the American Heart Association, Journal of Clinical Investigation, Annals of Internal Medicine and Symposium of Cardiac Arrhythmias for the American Journal of Medicine. He is co-editor of the Year Book of Cardiovascular and Renal Diseases and Harrison's Principles of Internal Medicine. Dr. Braunwald is also editor-in-chief of the Bulletin of the International Society of Cardiology.

As one of the physicians of outstanding caliber who is annually invited to Southwestern under the Bromberg Professorship, Dr. Braunwald will conduct ward rounds and seminars with students and house staff, discuss academic issues with faculty and present lectures. His host is the UT school's Department of Internal Medicine.

This year's Bromberg visiting professor has served as a member of the Medical Board of the National Institutes of Health, the Health Science Planning Council at the University of California at San Diego and the UCSD School of Medicine's Committee on Educational Policy.

A graduate of New York University and its medical school, he did his internship, as well as an assistant residency in medicine, at Mount Sinai Hospital. Dr. Braunwald was a research fellow in Columbia University Medical School's cardiopulmonary laboratory at Bellevue, a clinical associate at the NIH Laboratory of Cardiovascular Physiology and an assistant resident at Osler Medical Service of Johns Hopkins Hospital.

The researcher has served in several outstanding capacities at the National Heart Institute, including a stint as its clinical director. He has also been chairman of medicine at the University of California at San Diego's School of Medicine. Part-time appointments have included lecturer in physiology at George Washington University School of Medicine, clinical professor of medicine at Georgetown University School of Medicine and lecturer at Johns Hopkins University School of Medicine.
