DALLAS -- The first Graduate Student Research Forum of The University of Texas Southwestern Medical School at Dallas will be held Wednesday, May 14, at the school.

Sponsored by the Sigma Xi Club, a professional society of scientists and advanced graduate students, the Forum will offer eight scientific papers selected as outstanding examples of research work on the part of Southwestern graduate students studying in non-M.D. areas, said Dr. J. Richard Crout of the Department of Pharmacology, president of Sigma Xi.

The Forum will be held from 1 p.m. to 3:30 p.m. in the first floor lecture room at the school. Dr. Charles C. Sprague, dean, will open the program. Dr. Parkhurst A. Shore, associate dean for graduate studies, will preside. The program was arranged by Dr. Crout and Dr. Ivan Danhof of the Department of Physiology, secretary-treasurer of Sigma Xi. All of the papers to be presented have either been published recently or will appear soon in national professional journals, Dr. Crout said.
