UT SOUTHWESTERN HOSTS HEALTH CAREER SYMPOSIUM

DALLAS — February 11, 1994 — The STARS (Science Teacher Access to Resources at Southwestern) program of The University of Texas Southwestern Medical Center will host a health career symposium for high-school students from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. Saturday, March 5.

The symposium, which is organized by students from the High School for Health Professions in Dallas, will provide Dallas-Fort Worth high-school students the opportunity to interact with health-care professionals and learn about the requirements of a health-care career.

The keynote of the symposium will be a debate on health-care reform between Vivienne Armstrong, an active Democrat and state of Texas winner of the 1993 American Nurses Association Search for Excellence in Nursing, and William McKenzie, an editorial writer and columnist for *The Dallas Morning News* who has written about alternatives to the Clinton health plan.
