*****Kidney researcher, Dr. Jay H. Stein, named as 1980 Winans Visiting Professor at UTHSCD.

DALLAS--Dr. Jay H. Stein, a noted researcher of kidney disease and renal physiology, has been announced as the 1980 Winans Visiting Professor of Medicine at The University of Texas Health Science Center at Dallas. Dr. Stein, chairman of the Department of Medicine at The University of Texas Health Science Center at San Antonio, will lecture on "Pathology of Acute Renal Failure" at 11 a.m., April 17 in Richardson Lecture Hall, D1.502.

Dr. Stein, who is also a professor in the Department of Physiology and director of the Division of Renal Disease at UTHSCSA, is a graduate of the University of Tennessee Medical College. His extensive training includes residencies in Oklahoma, Iowa and a 1967-69 renal fellowship at Southwestern Medical School, Dallas.

In addition to serving on numerous national committees, including the National Kidney Foundation and the Kidney Council of the American Heart Association, Dr. Stein has authored over 70 publications, 60 abstracts and two major textbooks.

Traditionally, the Winans professor is a distinguished clinical scholar who is invited to conduct rounds with students and house staffs at Parkland Memorial Hospital and Baylor University Medical Center and to exchange ideas with the faculty in order to enrich the academic quality of the center's educational programs.

Funds to bring the visiting lecturer to Dallas each year are provided by the Southwestern Medical Foundation from the income for its Henry M. Winans Fund, established in 1966 by friends a patients of the late Dr. Winans, who was chairman of the Department of Internal Medicine at Southwestern Medical School and also chief of medicine at Baylor.
