DALLAS--Dr. John S. Chapman, assistant dean for postgraduate education at The University of Texas (Southwestern) Medical School at Dallas, has been named chief editor-elect of the journal "Archives of Environmental Health."

The periodical, which has around 6,000 circulation, is published by the American Medical Association on behalf of the American Academy of Occupational Medicine, Association of Teachers of Preventive Medicine and American College of Preventive Medicine.

Dr. Chapman already is chairman of the AMA's Council on Environmental and Public Health. The council does not, however, have a specific relationship with the journal.

Dr. Chapman is taking over the chief editor's post from Dr. Katharine R. Boucot, who is retiring in January. The Dallas professor has been on the board of the archives for some time.

The publication carries articles by epidemiologists, nutritionists, geophysicists, atmospheric scientists and others in the fields of environment and public health.

As chief editor, Dr. Chapman will select articles and determine their play in the magazine. The publication has a full-time staff of writers and editors in Chicago.

Dr. Chapman holds B.S. and M.A. degrees from Southern

Methodist University and an M.D. degree from The University of

Texas Medical Branch at Galveston.
