DALLAS--Dr. Paul B. Beeson, widely-known specialist in infectious diseases, will be at The University of Texas Southwestern Medical School Arpil 24-28 as the Winans Visiting Professor for 1972.

Dr. Beeson is a professor in the Nuffield Department of Clinical Medicine, Radcliffe Infirmary, at Oxford, England. Formerly, he was Ensign Professor of Medicine and Chairman of the Department of Medicine at Yale University. He was chairman of the Department of Medicine at Emory University prior to that.

He will deliver the Winans Lecture at 11 a.m. April 27 with the topic, "Studies on the Pathogensis of Eosinophilia."

This is a problem concerning a certain type of blood cell.

Traditionally, the visiting professor is a distinguished clinical scholar who is invited to conduct rounds with students and house staff of Parkland Memorial Hospital and Baylor University Medical Center, and exchange ideas with the faculty, so as to enrich the academic quality of the educational programs.

Funds to bring the visiting lecturer to Dallas each year are provided by Southwestern Medical Foundation from the income from its Henry M. Winans Fund, established in 1966 by friends and patients of the late Dr. Winans, who was chairman of the Department of Medicine at UTSWMS and also chief of medicine at Baylor.

This year's lecturer is a member of the U.S. National Academy of Sciences and master of the American College of Physicians. He is a fellow of the Royal College of Physicians and was president of the Association of American Physicians in 1967.

Dr. Beeson attended the University of Washington, then took M.D. and C.M. degrees from McGill University. He later was granted an M.A. degree from Yale, and honorary D.Sc. degrees from both Emory and McGill universities.

He is co-editor with W. McDermott of later editions of the Cecil-Loeb Textbook of Medicine (W.B. Saunders Co. 1971) and of a large number of scientific papers.
