## SOUTHWESTERN MEDICAL SCHOOL AT DALLAS

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DALLAS--Some of the latest automated teaching techniques used to update doctors and health workers will be shown in a special exhibit at The University of Texas Southwestern Medical School May 11-15.

The Roche Laboratories Resource Center will form the nucleus of the presentation with medical instructional subjects ranging from congestive heart failure to differential diagnosis. Augmenting this will be audiovisual programs developed by students and faculty at UTSMS under supervision of the Department of Instructional Communications.

The latter programs include a program sponsored by the school's Children and Youth Project for alerting mothers in disadvantaged areas on the dangers of iron deficiency anemia.

Included in the display will be an intensive refresher course developed by the Biochemistry Department at UTSMS, a programmed learning segment on neuropharmacology, and of the blood supply to the brain.

The exhibit will be open from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. in Room B-420 of the Cary Basic Science Building of Southwestern.

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
