programs are banding together to plan a special month spotlighting the problems of teen-age pregnancy. March 1983 has been designated the month for "Cherish the Children: Facing the Problems of Teen-age Pregnancy in Dallas."

In order to reach as many people in the area as possible, a speakers bureau has been organized. An outstanding group of volunteers will be vailable for presentations to PTAs, student groups, churches and civic and social clubs.

Problems resulting from inappropriate adolescent pregnancies may range from loss of educational opportunities for the mother to severe health problems for many of their premature infants and even child abuse. Not only are there often severe losses to the mother and child, but also the community as a whole is affected by this problem. Currently Texas has a 28 percent higher pregnancy rate in the 15-19 age group than any other state.
