**** Epilepsy Experts to Speak at Seizure Conference in Dallas

DALLAS--Nationally known epilepsy experts will address physicians and other health professionals in Dallas, March 22, at a medical conference sponsored by The University of Texas Health Science Center at Dallas and the Dallas Epilepsy Association. The meeting, which will be held at the Lincoln Hotel, will begin at 8:55 a.m.

The conference, "Current Techniques in Seizure Management," also features speakers from UTHSCD, Dallas Veterans Administration Medical Center, Children's Medical Center and Parkland Memorial Hospital.

"The program will provide a concise update on the most recent information regarding the treatment of epilepsy in children and adults," says Brandy Wismer, conference coordinator. Wismer is executive director of the Dallas Epilepsy Association.

Major addresses will be by Drs. Richard H. Mattson and John M. Freeman. Mattson is a professor of neurology at the Yale University School of Medicine and chief of neurology at the Veterans Administration Medical Center in New Haven, Conn. The program is accredited for continuing medical education. Six credit hours in Category I of the Physicians Recognition Award of the American Medical Association are available to doctors attending the program.
