## UT SOUTHWESTERN FACULTY RECEIVE HONORS

DALLAS – September 26, 1998 – Six faculty members from UT Southwestern Medical Center at Dallas were recognized recently for outstanding achievement in their fields:

- **Dr. Susan Cox** has been appointed assistant dean for professional education at UT Southwestern Medical Center. Cox, an associate professor of obstetrics and gynecology, also serves as medical director of the high-risk pregnancy unit at Parkland Memorial Hospital and will oversee UT Southwestern's expanding continuing education program for health-care professionals in her new position.
- **Dr. James McCulley**, chairman of ophthalmology at UT Southwestern Medical Center, has been appointed to the Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education standing panel for accreditation appeals in the specialty of ophthalmology. He will serve on the panel for a maximum of six years.
- **Dr. Rod Rohrich**, chairman of plastic surgery at UT Southwestern Medical Center, has been named co-editor of *Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery*, the journal of the American Society of Plastic and Reconstructive Surgeons and the official organ of the American Association of Plastic Surgeons. It is the most prestigious plastic surgery journal and has more than 15,000 readers monthly. Rohrich is also holder of the Crystal Charity Ball Distinguished Chair in Plastic Surgery.
- **Dr. Sridevi Devaraj,** pathology instructor at UT Southwestern Medical Center, was honored with the National Academy of Clinical Biochemistry's 1998 George Grannis Award for an outstanding scientific or clinical report.
- **Dr. Richard Lange**, associate professor of internal medicine at UT Southwestern Medical Center, received an Award of Merit from the American Heart Association, recognizing his exceptional level of personal commitment to the association's Dallas division.
- **Dr. James O'Malley**, staff veterinarian at UT Southwestern Medical Center, has been certified as a Diplomat of the American College of Laboratory Animal Medicine.
