NEWS ITEM, SOUTHWESTERN MEDICAL SCHOOL OF THE UNIVERSITY OF TEXAS

The Journal of the American Medical Association for May 31, 1952
(Volume 149, No. 5) includes Medical Licensure Statistics for 1951 (pp. 445-83).

This report indicates that Southwestern Medical School of the University of Texas is one of 19 medical schools in the United States whose graduates had no failures in taking Medical Examining Board Tests. There are 72 medical schools in the United States.
