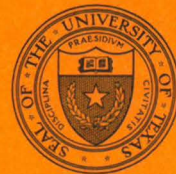


# NEWS RELEASE

DALLAS -- A day of orientation to the Dallas community will be held Tuesday, Sept. 3, for the 106 members of the new freshman class of The University of Texas Southwestern Medical School at Dallas.

Class members and their wives will meet at 9:45 Tuesday at the school to board a bus for downtown Dallas. There will be a tour of the downtown area, with guides giving a running account of plans for future development. There will be a brief visit to El Centro Junior College.

There will be a coffee break at the First National Bank, with R. H. Stewart III, the bank's Board Chairman, and Stanley Marcus on hand to welcome the students and their wives to Dallas. From downtown the bus will tour South Dallas, with youth leaders as tour guides to outline plans for redevelopment of the area.

Luncheon will be at the Museum of Fine Arts at Fair Park, with Mr. and Mrs. Eugene McDermott as hosts. Speakers will outline the activities programs of the museum, and others will tell of the programs of the Dallas Symphony Orchestra, the public library and other civic facilities.

From Fair Park the group will visit the campus of Southern Methodist University, with a stop at the new Fine Arts Center and its art galleries and theaters.
