UT SOUTHWESTERN FACULTY RECEIVE HONORS

DALLAS — Feb. 17, 1997 — The following UT Southwestern Medical Center at Dallas faculty members were recognized recently for outstanding achievement in their fields:

Bryon Adinoff, M.D., associate professor of psychiatry at UT Southwestern, received a Crusader for Prevention Award from Coalition '96 recently for his work in preventing substance abuse. Coalition '96, a project coordinated by the Greater Dallas Council on Alcohol and Drug Abuse, honors community leaders for their contributions in its crusade against substance abuse.

Robert W. McKenna, M.D., will head the 70,000-member American Society of Clinical Pathologists (ASCP) in 1997. He has served on its board of directors since 1988 and was elected vice president for 1995, president-elect for 1996 and president for 1997.

The ASCP is the nation's primary provider of continuing education for pathologists and other laboratory personnel. McKenna, executive vice chairman of pathology at UT Southwestern, received the group's distinguished service award in 1989 for his work in continuing education and has written many articles for books and journals on hematology, bone-marrow pathology and leukemia.
