DALLAS--Now that federal guidelines have mandated equal opportunities for women in higher education, are they being promoted?

Approximately 50 delegates from Texas colleges and universities who have been identified by their institutions as possible future administrators will gather on the campus of The University of Texas Health Science Center at Dallas Nov. 13 - 14. The program is sponsored by the American Council on Education's National Identification Program for Women in Higher Education Administration. Also in attendance will be women administrators who are hoping for further advancement and male administrators who are interested in advancing women on their campuses.

Thursday evening's dinner speaker will be Dr. Emily Taylor, director, Office of Women, American Council on Education. She will address the opening session, meeting at 5:30 in the A.W. Harris Faculty/Alumni Center on the UTHSCD campus. The group will be welcomed by Dr. Charles C. Sprague, UTHSCD president, who will also be a participant in the conference. Chairwoman for the meeting is Dr. Janet Aune, assistant to the vice chancellor for health affairs, The University of Texas System. Dr. Bettie Sue Masters, UTHSCD faculty member, will attend along with Sprague.

Speaking Friday morning at 8:30 will be Dr. Elsbeth Rostow, dean, the LBJ School of Public Affairs on The University of Texas' Austin campus. Her speech will be "Thoughts on Gynecocracy: or Will Success Spoil the American Woman?"

A panel will follow on "Reflections on Success: Women in Higher Education."

College; Betty Jo Hay, member, Commission on Colleges, Southern Association of

Colleges and Schools; Eleanor Ott, president, Eastfield College; and Dr. Frank
