DALLAS--A medical librarianship course held on campus of The University of Texas Health Science Center at Dallas has been expanded to two semesters, beginning this fall.

The course offered by North Texas State University School of Library and Information Science is taught by faculty members of the health science center.

Dr. Joe McCord, assistant director for resource utilization at the center said, "Because of the increasing complexity of information science, the medical librarianship course has been divided into two three-hour courses for the next academic year."

Bibliographic control of medical literature and reference will be offered in the fall, administration and organization in the spring.

This fall the course will be taught by a UTHSCD faculty team consisting of Dr. McCord, Mrs. Patti Armes, assistant director for resource organization, and John Murphey, associate director of the TALON regional medical program. In addition, other library faculty members will contribute to the course by lecturing or offering demonstrations in their areas of specialization.

The medical librarianship course, open to graduate students or practicing librarians, is required for certification by the Medical Library Association.
