BROWNING CONTRIBUTES FUNDS TO UT SOUTHWESTERN RESEARCH EFFORTS

DALLAS - September 16, 1994 - Because of her admiration for the accomplishments of scientists at The University of Texas Southwestern Medical Center at Dallas, Jane H. Browning has donated \$250,000 to the medical center's fund-raising campaign. Mrs. Browning's gift will be matched through UT Southwestern's Fund for Molecular Research and will establish an endowed chair.

"I have watched UT Southwestern do such wonderful things in the last two decades, and the last decade has been truly incredible," Mrs. Browning said.

"I've also been very impressed by the quality of personnel the medical center has attracted."

Her personal interest in medical research increased substantially after her husband died of heart disease 17 years ago. "I recognize the wonderful work in which the doctors and scientists at UT Southwestern are involved," she said.

Browning chose not to specify a particular area of research for her gift, but intends for the funds to be used for the projects that have the greatest potential for improving people's lives.

Dr. Kern Wildenthal, president of UT Southwestern, said, "Mrs. Browning's gift is wonderful. If we had to rely solely on government funds, we would never achieve our goal of becoming the best medical school in the world, but with the help of civic leaders such as Mrs. Browning, we will surely succeed."

Mrs. Browning manages an investment business, which she took over after her husband's death. Despite her busy work schedule, Mrs. Browning has been involved in a number of community activities including Dallas Services for Visually
