DALLAS--Dr. John Chapman, assistant dean for postgraduate education at The University of Texas Southwestern Medical School at Dallas, has departed for the far east where he will lecture and study a puzzling bone disease in Afghanistan.

Dr. Chapman is chairman of the American Medical Association's Council on Environmental and Public Health and is editor of the journal, "Archives of Environmental Health."

He will lecture on environmental health in Hawaii and on sarcoidosis in Tokyo. After a visit to Hong Kong, he will proceed to Jalalabad in east Afghanistan to study "a destructive disease of the bone which appears to resemble tuberculosis." He will base his work at a new medical school in that city which already has had visits from two other UTSMS faculty members.

Dr. Chapman will return to the United States in about a month.
