DALLAS -- Dr. Donald W. Seldin, Buchanan professor and chairman of Internal Medicine at The University of Texas (Southwestern) Medical School at Dallas, is on a three-week lecture tour spanning two continents.

Dr. Seldin, an internationally recognized authority on diseases of the kidney, is speaking this month in six Australia and New Zealand cities as honorary professor of the Australasian Society of Nephrology. Lectures on various aspects of kidney function and disorders were scheduled in Sydney, Melbourne, Brisbane and Adelaide in Australia, and in Christchurch, Dunedin and Auckland in New Zealand.

The Dallas scientist also will address medical audiences in Rome, Munich and Madrid before returning to Dallas March 1.

Dr. Seldin is author or co-author of more than 75 published reports on his scientific investigations. He is retiring president of the Scientific Advisory Board of the National Kidney Foundation and is past president of the American Society of Nephrology. He has also been president of the Southern Society of Clinical Investigation, the Central Society for Clinical Research and the American Society for Clinical Investigation.

Dr. Seldin has been a member of the Dallas medical school faculty since 1951 and chairman of its Department of Internal Medicine since 1952.
