University Hospital \$100,000

Ronald F. Garvey, M.D., M.B.A., president and chief executive officer of Zale Lipshy University Hospital at Southwestern Medical Center, announced that First City, Texas today contributed \$100,000 to the hospital.

Darryl D. Pounds, chairman and chief executive officer for First City, Texas-Dallas and regional director for First City's North Texas Region, presented the check to Dr. Garvey. Also on hand for the presentation was John Bunten, president of First City Texas-Dallas.

University Hospital," said Dr. Garvey. "It's an investment that will

University Hospital opened the last week of November 1989. It is a 160-bed private referral, teaching and research hospital at The University of Texas Southwestern Medical Center at Dallas. University Hospital is still conducting an active fund-raising campaign for the purchase of equipment.

Sam Prince, development officer for University Hospital's Corporate Campaign, says the campaign has raised \$1.1 million so far. The goal is \$3.7 million.

The overall fund-raising campaign has netted more than \$31 million dollars, says development officer George Charlton, primarily from individuals and corporate-related foundations.
