DALLAS — May 30, 1996 — Three UT Southwestern Medical Center at Dallas faculty members were recognized recently for outstanding achievement in their fields.

Dr. Cole Giller, assistant professor of neurological surgery, received the Cerebrovascular Research Award, presented at the 1996 Cerebral Hemodynamics and Embolism Symposium held recently at the Hyatt Regency Dallas at Reunion. The award was given for the abstract "Estimation of Changes in Vessel Diameter by Use of Weighted Spectral Intensities: Angiographic Verification."

Giller, who received his medical degree from the University of California, Los Angeles, (UCLA) School of Medicine and his doctorate from the University of California, Berkeley, is a North Dallas resident.

Dr. Richard Mabry, professor of otorhinolaryngology, has been elected a scientific fellow of the American College of Allergy, Asthma and Immunology.
