DALLAS--Daniel D. Federman, M.D., will be on campus March 17-22 at The University of Texas Health Science Center at Dallas as Winan Visiting Professor of Medicine for 1974.

Dr. Federman, an outstanding endocrinologist and internist, is chairman of the Stanford University School of Medicine's department of medicine and physician-in-chief at Stanford University Hospital. He is author of many publications in both areas.

The Winan Lecture will be presented as Grand Rounds Thursday,

March 21 at 11 a.m. in the Staff Library, Parkland Hospital. Dr.

Federman's topic will be "The Integration of the Endocrine Function."

Traditionally the visiting professor is a distinguished clinical scholar who is invited to conduct rounds with students and house staff of Parkland Hospital and Baylor University and to exchange ideas with the faculty in order to enrich the academic quality of the educational programs.

Funds to bring the visiting lecturer to Dallas each year are provided by Southwestern Medical Foundation from the income for its Henry M. Winans Fund, established in 1966 by friends and patients of the late Dr. Winans, who was chairman of the Department of Medicine at Southwestern Medical School and also chief of medicine at Baylor.

A graduate of Harvard College, magna cum laude, and Harvard Medical School, magna cum laude, the physician took over his duties at Stanford in 1973. In 1972 he was Visiting Professor of Medicine at the University of London's Middlesex Hospital Medical School.

Dr. Federman began his academic career as an assistant in medicine at Harvard Medical School in 1959. He has since served at Massachusetts General Hospital, where he was chief of the Endocrine Unit, and filled the successive positions of Assistant Dean and Associate Dean of the Faculty of Medicine for Continuing Education at Harvard. He held the faculty rank of associate professor.

Dr. Federman, whose graduate work in medicine was done at Massachusetts General Hospital, the National Institute of Arthritis and Metabolic Diseases, University College Hospital Medical School in London, England, and at Harvard, has been a member of the American Board of Internal Medicine since 1970. Since 1971, he has served on the Editorial Board of the Journal of Clinical Endocrinology and Metabolism.

His memberships include Alpha Omega Alpha, the Endocrine Society, the American Society for Human Genetics and the Association of Professors of Medicine. He is a diplomat of the American Board of Internal Medicine and was a fellow of the American College of Physicians in 1967.
