Also, Betty O'Rourke, executive director of the Panhandle Emergency Medical Services System, will speak on "Regionalized Burn Care: What it Means to the Patient, the Hospital and the Professional."

Tuesday's program will be made up of workshops on reconstructive surgery, rehabilitation procedures at Parkland Memorial Hospital, adult and pediatric burn nursing and the future of regionalized health care delivery in Texas.
