******Winborn lecture to cover drug-induced nasal problems.*

DALLAS--Dr. Karl M. Morgenstein has been named lecturer for the Claude D. Winborn Lecture to be held December 3 at The University of Texas Health Science Center at Dallas.

The lecture will be part of a two and one-half day symposium on "Diseases of the Paranasal Sinuses" December 2-4 at the health science center.

Dr. Morgenstein, clinical associate professor at the University of Miami and one of the outstanding authorities in the field of otolaryngology, will speak on "Nasal Problems of Drug Origin." The lecture will be on that Friday at 6:30 p.m. It will be held in the Alfred W. Harris Faculty Center on campus.

The Claude D. Winborn lectureship series was established in 1967, honoring the man who served as chairman of the otolaryngology division at Southwestern Medical School, now part of the health science center, from 1956 to 1966.

Sponsors of Dr. Morgenstein's visit are the otolaryngology division, the Dallas Academy of Otolaryngology and the A. Webb Roberts Center for Continuing Education.

Dr. Henry M. Carder, associate professor and chairman of the otolaryngology division at the health science center, is the program chairman for the symposium which will provide a complete review and update of current concepts in the diagnosis and treatment of sinus disease. The program will include basic lectures on anatomy and physiology of the paranasal sinuses, clinical evaluation and medical and surgical treatment of sinus disease and televised closed circuit dissections and surgical cases.

The otolaryngology division and the Dallas Academy of Otolaryngology are sponsoring the symposium.
