DALLAS -- Dr. Philip O'Bryan Montgomery, Jr., 47, Professor of Pathology, has been named Associate Dean of The University of Texas Southwestern Medical School, Dr. Charles C. Sprague, Dean, announced today.

A graduate of SMU and Columbia University Medical School, Dr.

Montgomery was named Assistant Professor of Pathology at Southwestern in 1952, Associate Professor in 1953 and Professor in 1961. He is a Diplomate of the American Board of Pathology, in Pathologic Anatomy, Clinical Pathology and Forensic Pathology.

Dr. Montgomery is a Fellow of the American Society of Clinical Pathologists, Royal Microscopical Society and New York Academy of Sciences. He is a member of the scientific advisory committee of the Damon Runyon Fund for Cancer Research; of the Pathology Study Section of the National Institutes of Health, and the editorial boards of Space Life Sciences Journal and Texas Reports on Biology and Medicine Journal.

His scientific society memberships include The American Association of Pathologists and Bacteriologists, The American Association for Cancer Research, The International Academy of Pathology, The American Academy of Forensic Sciences, The Society of Experimental Biology and Medicine, founding member of the Law-Science Academy of America and the Law-Science Foundation, The American Society for Experimental Pathology, The American Society for Cell Biology, The Tissue Culture Association, The Biophysical Society and the Dallas, County, Texas, Southern, American and Pan American Medical Associations.

Following graduation from medical school, Dr. Montgomery served an internship at Mary Imogene Bassett Hospital, Cooperstown, N.Y., was a U.S. Army captain and resident in pathology at the Veterans Administration Hospital at McKinney, Texas, and was research assistant in pathology and cancer research at the Cancer Research Institute of New England Beaconess Hospital, Boston, prior to joining the faculty at Southwestern.

Dr. Montgomery is a former president of the Dallas County Hospital District Medical Staff, former Dallas County medical examiner, and currently is a member of the senior staff of Pathology at Parkland Memorial Hospital and consulting pathologist for the Veterans Administration Hospital at Lisbon, St. Paul Hospital at Dallas.

Dr. Montgomery is author or co-author of more than 90 papers published in scientific journals, some 70 abstracts reporting on scientific research, and has presented some 40 papers at scientific meetings and conventions.

Active in Dallas community affairs, Dr. Montgomery is a trustee and chairman of the executive committee of St. Mark's School. He is a past president of Planned Parenthood of Dallas, former board member of the Dallas Council on World Affairs, a director of the Dallas Mental Health Society, secretary of the former organizing committee for the molecular sciences laboratory of the Southwest Center for Advanced Studies, a trustee of the Lamplighter School, former board member of the Metropolitan Dallas YMCA, founding member of the Dallas Philosophical Society, chairman of the board for restoration of the Gillespie County Courthouse in Fredericksburg, Texas, a former director of the Visiting Nurses Association of Dallas, and founding member and past president of the Optical Society of Texas.

The Montgomerys make their home at 6343 Kalani Place, Dallas. His wife is the former Ruth Ann Rogers who made her debut in Dallas in the early fifties. They have four sons, Philip III, Carter Rogers, Will Stuart and Harold Hench Montgomery.
