DALLAS -- Some two dozen of the nation's top experts in analyzing human blood will gather at The University of Texas Southwestern Medical School at Dallas Sunday through Wednesday (June 15-18).

The occasion will be a workshop sponsored jointly by the medical school and the Committee on Reference Laboratories of the American Association of Blood Banks, said Dr. Ruth Guy, associate professor of pathology at Southwestern and director of the Parkland Memorial Hospital Blood Bank.

"It will be a sort of master's workshop in immunohematology," said Dr. Guy. The reference laboratories, she said, are those that are handed the difficult blood problems that have baffled the regular blood laboratories.

There is no planned program or agenda for the workshop, the Dallas professor said. Each hematologist will bring notes and data on his own recent problem cases, and the specialists will spend the four days discussing these problems and comparing data on how the problems were solved.

Sessions will be held in a lecture room at the medical school.
