Dr. Walle J.H. Nauta, professor of Neuroanatomy at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, will speak to the North Texas Chapter of the Society for Neuroscience on Monday, April 28, at 7 p.m. in the freshman lecture hall (Room D1.700) on The University of Texas Health Science Center at Dallas campus.

Dr. Nauta's topic will be "Convergence of Sensory Processes in the Cerebral Cortex." The seminar is being held in conjunction with Marion Laboratories and Callier Center for Communication Disorders.

An associate of the Massachusetts Institute of Technology since 1964, Dr. Nauta is a recipient of the American Philosophical Society's Karl Spencer Lashley Award. He is currently on the research career development awards committee of the National Institute of Mental Health, and is a member of the National Academy of Science.

He also holds memberships with the American Association of Anatomy and the Swiss Association of Anatomy.
