This is a repository for sharing, citing, and preserving research data. It is free and open to all researchers. Content includes datasets.

BigMouth Dental Data Repository

This repository contains de-identified EHR data contributed by dental schools who are part of a consortium. Access is only available to data contributors within particular institutions. Among the contributing institutions are Harvard, Tufts University, The University of California, San Francisco, The University of Pittsburgh, UTHealth.

Providing access to the output of the institution, this repository has over 27,000 items. Content includes articles, conference materials, theses, and more. Statistics for items is publicly-viewable, allowing users to see information about top cities and countries accessing content, as well as monthly visit counts and file access counts.

This provides a persistent digital identifier that distinguishes you from every other researcher and, through integration in key research workflows such as manuscript and grant submission, supports automated linkages between you and your professional activities ensuring that your work is recognized. Use of ORCID identifiers for the ETD submission system used by UT Southwestern is currently under development through the Texas Digital Library.
