DALLAS--Dr. Robert G. Petersdorf, internationally known researcher in infectious disease, will visit The University of Texas Health Science Center at Dallas Nov. 3-7 as the Mr. and Mrs. I.G. Bromberg Visiting Professor of Medicine.

He will present "Some Clinical and Experimental Features of Bacterial Endocarditis" at Internal Medicine Grand Rounds Nov. 6 at 11 a.m. in the Richardson Lecture Hall (Room D1.502). In addition to his major lecture he will meet with faculty and students throughout the week and will present a renal research conference.

Petersdorf is professor of medicine at Harvard Medical School and president of Affiliated Hospitals Center (Robert B. Brigham, Peter B. Brigham and Boston Hospital for Women). Until last year he was chairman of the Department of Medicine at the University of Washington School of Medicine.

Elected to the National Academy of Sciences in 1973, Petersdorf now chairs the Membership Committee and the Steering Committee of the Task Force on Clinical Investigation in Developing Countries. He serves on the Executive Committee of the Association of American Medical Colleges. He is also a member of the Liaison Committee on Graduate Medical Education.

Petersdorf serves on the Council of the National Institute of Allergy and Infectious Diseases of the National Institutes of Health. He is editor of Harrison's Principles of Internal Medicine and is on the editorial board of Merck Manual, "Journal of Chronic Diseases" and "American Review of Respiratory Disease."

He is a member of numerous professional organizations and advisory boards and has published nearly 300 scientific papers.

The Department of Internal Medicine of Southwestern Medical School, a component of UTHSCD, annually hosts such an outstanding physician through the Bromberg professorship.
