DALLAS -- The American College of Physicians will sponsor a four-day meeting on "Physiological Concepts of Clinical Disease" at The University of Texas Southwestern Medical School in Dallas March 3-6, 1969, Dr. Donald W. Seldin, Professor and Chairman of the Department of Internal Medicine at Southwestern, announced today.

Dr. Seldin will be director of the four-day course, with Dr. Marvin D. Siperstein, Professor of Internal Medicine, as co-director.

Guest faculty will include four outstanding specialists in internal medicine from medical schools across the nation. These are: Dr. Benjamin Burrows, professor of medicine and head of the pulmonary section of the Department of Internal Medicine, The University of Arizona College of Medicine, Tucson, Ariz.; Dr. David M. Kipnis, professor and director of the Clinical Research Center, School of Medicine, Washington University, St. Louis, Mo.; Dr. John Ross, Jr., professor of medicine, The University of California at San Diego, and Dr. William B. Schwartz, professor of medicine, Tufts University School of Medicine, Boston, Mass.

first add meeting

In addition to the guest faculty, some 25 members of the Southwestern faculty will participate in the courses. All sessions will be held in the auditorium of Children's Medical Center, adjacent to the medical school and to Parkland Memorial Hospital.

The course will be offered in eight sessions of a half-day each, over a period of four days. Enrollment will be limited to 240. Each of the sessions will include several lectures, concluding with a panel discussion. The general topics are: edema and hypertension; disorders of acid-base balance; diabetes mellitus, endocrine disorders; liver and gastroenterology; immunologic disease; cardiovascular disease, and pulmonary disease. Session chairmen, all from the Southwestern faculty, will be Drs. Seldin, Siperstein, Floyd C. Rector, Jr., L. L. Madison, John Fordtran, Morris Ziff, Jere Mitchell and Alan Pierce.

Dr. Seldin pointed out that physicians interested in attending the four-day course may address registrations, requests for information and applications to the American College of Physicians, Philadelphia, Pa.
