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******UTHSCD names new chairman of the Department of Family Practice & Community Medicine.

DALLAS--The creator of a nationally famous residency program in family practice has been named chairman of the Department of Family Practice and Community Medicine of Southwestern Medical School, a component of The University of Texas Health Science Center at Dallas.

Dr. Winfrey W. Goldman Jr., presently assistant dean for clinical affairs and medical director of John Peter Smith Hospital, will assume his duties as chairman on June 15, announced Dr. Frederick Bonte, dean of Southwestern.

Dr. Goldman was selected by a search committee composed of senior faculty members.

After interviewing a number of candidates, they realized that "few physicians in the United

States have had as much experience in training residents for family practice as Dr. Goldman,"

says Dr. Bonte. "His family practice residency program at JPS is the largest in Texas and

one of the largest, if not the largest, in the country."

For the last 16 years, Dr. Goldman has been involved in planning, developing, implementing, improving and managing general practice and family practice residency program at JPS. During this period, he has been medical director; director of medicine education; program director, general practice and family practice residency programs.

A native of Dallas, Dr. Goldman received his Bachelor of Science degree from Southern Methodist University and his M.D. degree from Southwestern in 1953. His internship and residency were both taken at Parkland Memorial Hospital.

After service in the United States Air Force, Dr. Goldman joined the Southwestern faculty and has held several academic appointments. In 1968-69, he was assistant dean of the medical school; since 1974, he has been assistant dean for clinical affairs of the school at JPS. He is also clinical professor of internal medicine.

According to Dr. Goldman, Dr. Marion Zetzman, acting chairman of Family Practice and Community Medicine and well-recognized in the medical community for his studies of experimental methods of health care delivery, will become chairman of the division of community medicine. Dr. Goldman is also actively searching for a chairman of the new division of family practice.
