Maclin family donates \$100,000 to establish professorship in medical science

DALLAS – March 30, 2006 – Todd and Diana Maclin of Dallas have donated \$100,000 to establish the Maclin Family Professorship in Medical Science at UT Southwestern Medical Center.

The gift was made to Southwestern Medical Foundation and named in honor of the Maclin family, which includes their daughter, Brinkley, a junior at the University of Georgia, and their son, Sam, a freshman at Austin College.

Mr. Maclin, Commercial Bank chief executive officer at JPMorgan Chase & Co., said family members have been treated at UT Southwestern University Hospitals and have benefited from the medical center's clinical care and research studies.

"UT Southwestern has been a tremendous amenity for us as a place to get the best-in-class care," Mr. Maclin said. "We're fortunate to be able to do this, and we want to be helpful when we can."

The family wishes to support the work of a biomedical researcher engaged in one of the priority areas at UT Southwestern, Mr. Maclin said.

"We greatly appreciate Todd and Diana's confidence in UT Southwestern University Hospitals," said Dr. Kern Wildenthal, president of UT Southwestern. "Their generous contribution will be of great help in our efforts to advance biomedical research and clinical care."

The couple, married 23 years, have also contributed to Children's Medical Center Dallas, where rooms are named in honor of their two children.

Mr. Maclin graduated from UT Austin and earned a master of business administration from the University of Houston before beginning his banking career. Mrs. Maclin attended the University of Arkansas. The couple met in Houston while working in the same building.

Mrs. Maclin retired as a recruiter for a legal firm to raise their children. After living in Austin and Houston, the family settled in Dallas more than a decade ago. Brinkley graduated from Highland Park High School and Sam graduated from Cistercian Preparatory School.

Mr. Maclin's career in the banking industry spans more than a quarter of a century. He began at Texas Commerce Bank, which later merged with Chemical Bank, then Chase, and eventually with

Maclin family members have been active in many civic and business-related boards and activities.
