## **AIDS PREVENTION PROJECT OPENS NEW LOCATION FOR HIV TESTING, TRAINING, AND RESEARCH**

DALLAS – Dec. 16, 1996 – The AIDS Prevention Project has relocated to permanent offices in the NationsBank Building in Oak Cliff.

The AIDS Prevention Project, a program of the Division of Infectious Diseases at UT Southwestern Medical Center at Dallas, offers free anonymous or confidential HIV testing and counseling by appointment, HIV prevention outreach, off-site counseling and testing, HIV prevalence and behavioral research, and behavioral change training.

"Our new facility ideally suits our project efforts, which have always been community-based. We have been dedicated to the prevention of HIV in the Dallas area for over 10 years," said Anne Freeman, program director.

The AIDS Prevention Project, formerly affiliated with Dallas County Health Department, became part of the Department of Internal Medicine at UT Southwestern in January. The programs are funded by grants from the Texas Department of Health, the national Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, and the City of Dallas.
