Dr. Sutherland is a professor of physiology at Vanderbilt University School of Medicine and is a career investigator for the American Heart Association.

His honors include the Banting Memorial Lectureship and Medal, the Sollman Award from the American Society for Pharmacology and Experimental Therapeutics, the Gairdner (cq) Award from the Gairdner Foundation, the Dickson Award of the University of Pittsburgh and honorary doctorates from Yale and Washington University.

Dr. Sutherland has been a member of a number of study sections for the Public Health Service and National Institutes of Health.
