DALLAS--Opening the twenty-seventh annual Scientific Assembly of the Texas Academy of Family Physicians to be held in Dallas October 17-19 will be an address by Dr. B. Leslie Huffman, Jr., president of the American Academy. The three-day meeting which, will be co-sponsored by The University of Texas Health Science Center at Dallas, will be held at the Marriott Motor Hotel.

Also on the opening program will be Richard M. Zaner, Ph.D., from SMU in Dallas, who will speak on "The Spirit of '76--History and Philosophy of Medicine." Others will include Dr. Mario E. Ramirez, president of the group; Dr. Charles C. Sprague, president of The University of Texas Health Science Center at Dallas; Dr. Frederick J. Bonte, dean of The University of Texas Southwestern Medical School at Dallas; and Dr. Kenneth G. DuBois, president of the Dallas County Chapter of the Texas Academy. A special Bi-centennial tribute will be presented by Nolan Moore Productions.

Dr. Philip Thorek of Chicago, Ill., will highlight the second day's program when he gives the annual Sinks McLarty Memorial Lecture. Dr. Thorek has spoken each year in the meeting's 27-year history.
