DALLAS--Dr. Bruce D. Fallis, professor of pathology at The University of Texas Southwestern Medical School, has been chosen as a "Piper Professor of 1973."

The Dallas educator is one of 10 outstanding professors chosen from across Texas by the board of directors of the Minnie Stevens Piper Foundation. The agency is an operating foundation carrying out programs in aid to education.

Cited by the foundation for his "dedicated teaching talent," Dr. Fallis previously has been the recipient of similar awards. He was honored with a pair of "Distinguished Teaching Awards" presented by the freshman and sophomore classes in 1971.

Dr. Fallis and his wife were given a skiing vacation in Europe later that year by a group of approximately 60 pathology residents who had trained with him.

The specialist is the author of a textbook on pathology and the coauthor of a book on histology.

He received his Bachelor of Arts degree from Texas Christian University in 1948 and his M.D. degree from Washington University in St. Louis in 1952. He has been with Southwestern Medical School since April 1, 1957.
