******Endocrinologist, Grant Liddle, will
give Winans Lecture March 6.*

DALLAS--Grant Liddle, M.D., will be visiting The University of Texas Health Science Center campus March 3-7 as the Winans Visiting Professor of Medicine for 1975.

Dr. Liddle, an outstanding endocrinologist, is professor and chairman of the Department of Medicine at Vanderbilt University School of Medicine.

The Winans Lecture will be presented as Grand Rounds Thursday, March 6 at 11 a.m. in the Tom and Lula Gooch Auditorium at the Health Science Center. Dr. Liddle's topic will be "Proposed Solutions for Three Endocrinological Enigmas."

Traditionally the visiting professor is a distinguished clinical scholar who is invited to conduct rounds with students and house staff of Parkland Hospital and Baylor University and to exchange ideas with the faculty in order to enrich the academic quality of the educational programs.

Funds to bring the visiting lecturer to Dallas each year are provided by Southwestern Medical Foundation from the income for its Henry M. Winans Fund, established in 1966 by friends and patients of the late Dr. Winans, who was chairman of the Department of Medicine at Southwestern Medical School and also chief of medicine at Baylor.

Dr. Liddle is a graduate of the University of California School of Medicine and the University of Utah. He has been at Vanderbilt since 1961, where he is also chief of Endocrine Service. He was a recipient of the Research Career Award (1962-1968) from the U.S. Public Health Service (USPHS), and also received the Henry Hallett Dale Medal in 1973 in the field of endocrinology.

He has been a member of the Endocrinology Study Section of the USPHS and the Postgraduate Committee of The Endocrine Society. He has served as chairman of the USPHS Diabetes and Metabolism Training Grants Committee and has been on the National Advisory Arthritis and Metabolic Diseases Council of the USPHS.

Dr. Liddle has also headed the American and Southern Societies for Clinical Investigation, the executive committee of the International Society of Endocrinology and the Nashville Society for Internal Medicine. He has authored numerous papers dealing with endocrinology.
