NATIONSBANK PLEDGES \$250,000 TO FUND FOR MOLECULAR RESEARCH

DALLAS--NationsBank, Texas' largest, has pledged \$250,000 to The University of Texas Southwestern Medical Center at Dallas for its Fund for Molecular Research campaign.

"Our bank is proud of its long-standing association with the UT Southwestern Medical Center," said Timothy Hartman, chairman of NationsBank West. "We are pleased to offer this tangible measure of support for the outstanding teaching and research services this institution provides for the benefit of all Texas citizens."

Dr. Kern Wildenthal, UT Southwestern president, said, "When corporations contribute to a campaign such as this one, they are contributing to research to further the bounds of our scientific knowledge. We are grateful that NationsBank has chosen to participate in the campaign to enhance scientific research at UT Southwestern."

A unique feature of the current campaign makes funds available to match Nationbank's \$250,000 gift.

NationsBank Corp. is the fourth largest banking organization in the United States. It has banks in nine states and the District of Columbia, with assets of more than \$118 billion. Its Texas bank is the largest in the state.

This gift is the second given to UT Southwestern. In 1989 NationsBank pledged \$100,000.
