DALLAS--Second annual commencement exercises for the School of Allied Health Professions of The University of Texas Southwestern Medical School will be held Friday (Aug. 18) at 8 p.m. in the Weiss Educational Building Auditorium, 209 Oakenwald, at Methodist Hospital of Dallas. At that time fifty-two candidates will receive certificates and degrees in four health fields.

The 52 degrees and certificates mark a significant increase over last year's 38, according to Dr. John W. Schermerhorn, dean of the School of Allied Health Professions. Certificate awardees are those students who enter the programs already holding bachelors' degrees from other institutions.

The school opened in September, '70 with 57 students enrolled. Authorized by The University of Texas System Board of Regents to help relieve shortages of allied health professionals, the institution now has 22 full and many more part-time faculty. During the '71-'72 school year, 70 students attended classes.

This year's commencement address will be given by Dr. Schermerhorn, who will also preside. Conferring the degrees will be Dr. Charles C. Sprague, dean of The University of Texas Southwestern Medical School.

Dr. Donald A. Pool, chairman of the Department of Rehabilitation Science in the health professions school, will serve as parade marshal. Assistant marshal will be Ms. Joan V. Fawns, UT allied health professions instructor. Invocation and benediction will be given by the Rev. Mr. Ronald Littlejohn, director of student religious activities at Baylor University Medical Center.
