*\*\*\*\*\*Noted hematologist Dr. Alvin Tarlov  
to be Winans Visiting Professor at  
UT Southwestern Medical School.*

DALLAS--Dr. Alvin Tarlov will lecture at The University of Texas Health Science Center March 7-11 as the Henry M. Winans Visiting Professor of Medicine for 1977.

Dr. Tarlov, professor and chairman of medicine at the University of Chicago, is one of the world's leading authorities in the field of hematology.

He will present the Winans lecture as Grand Rounds at 11 a.m. Thursday, March 10, in the Richardson Lecture Hall on campus. Dr. Tarlov's topic will be "The Primary Care Issue--A Quantitative Approach."

Traditionally the Winans professor is a distinguished clinical scholar who is invited to conduct rounds with students and house staff of Parkland Memorial Hospital and Baylor University Medical Center and to exchange ideas with the faculty in order to enrich the academic quality of the health science center's educational programs.

Funds to bring the visiting lecturer to Dallas each year are provided by the Southwestern Medical Foundation from its Henry M. Winans Fund, established in 1966 by friends and patients of the late Dr. Winans, who was chairman of the Department of Internal Medicine at Southwestern Medical School and also chief of medicine at Baylor.

Dr. Tarlov is a graduate of the University of Chicago School of Medicine, where he has been chairman of the Department of Medicine since 1969.

He is currently serving as director of a national study of internal medicine manpower needs for the Federated Council of Internal Medicine. He is also a member of the American Society of Hematology, a fellow of the American College of Physicians, and is serving as secretary-treasurer of the Association of Professors of Medicine.

Dr. Tarlov is the author of more than 40 scientific articles.
